Global Classmates is a 6-month online exchange program for high schools students in Japan and the U.S., which aims to promote international friendship, cultural exchange, and collaborative foreign language learning.

Application Process & Program Flow

KAC pairs schools based on number of students, technology capabilities, and participation structure and initiates preparation for the exchange. The students participate in Global Classmates as part of a class at least one hour per week.

In Global Classmates, students from Japan and the U.S. exchange messages, photos and videos via a secure and monitored educational social media website under the supervision and guidance of their teachers and a bilingual and bicultural coordinator assigned by KAC.

In the past three years, KAC has connected more than 2,000 students from 86 schools.
